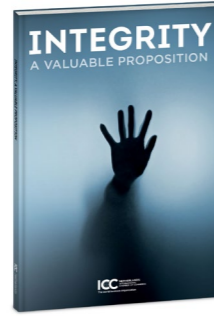

Ms. Sigrid Kaag

Minister for Foreign Trade and Development Cooperation of The Netherlands

Sigrid Kaag has been Minister for Foreign Trade and Development Cooperation of The Netherlands since 2017. Before that, Sigrid Kaag was a Dutch diplomat working for the United Nations and served as the United Nations Special Coordinator for Lebanon (UNSCOL) in 2015. She earned an M.Phil. degree in International Relations from St. Antony's College, University of Oxford and an M.A. degree in Politics and Economics of the Middle East from the University of Exeter.

Prof. Frans de Waal

Primatologist and Director, Living Links Center at the Yerkes National Primate Research Center

Prof. Frans De Waal is C. H. Candler Professor in the Psychology Department of Emory University and Director of the Living Links Center at the Yerkes National Primate Research Center, in Atlanta, Georgia. Since 2013, he is a Distinguished Professor at Utrecht University. In 2007, he was selected by Time as one of The Worlds' 100 Most Influential People Today, and in 2011 by Discover as among 47 (all time) Great Minds of Science.

Prof. Mark Pieth

Co-founder and Director, Basel Institute on Governance

Mark Pieth has been a Professor of Criminal Law and Criminology at the University of Basel in Switzerland since 1993. He is an expert in the areas of economic crime, criminal law, criminal procedure and sanctioning. From 1990 to 2013 he chaired the OECD Working Group on Bribery. He is the founder and Chair of the Basel Institute on Governance.

Vice President of Ethics and Corporate Responsibility, Thales Group

Dominique Lamoureux is Vice President Ethics and Corporate Responsibility at Thales. He is involved in the prevention of corruption within numerous business organisations such as Medef, the International Chamber of Commerce and the United Nations Global Compact, by participating in committees and working groups.

Chair, Dutch National Contact Point OECD Guidelines

Maartje van Putten has been Chair of the Dutch National Contact Point on OECD Guidelines for multinational enterprises since May 2018. Previously, she worked as senior advisor and mediator for the European Investment Bank Complaints Mechanism. She is a member of the supervisory board to several organisations and is Associate Lecturer at the Windesheim Hogeschool in the Netherlands.

Etjen Xhafaj is Deputy Minister for Europe and Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Albania. Before that, Etjen Xhafaj was the Director of the Minister's Cabinet for the Albanian Ministry of Finance and he was a Research Fellow with the Center for International Development at Harvard Kennedy School of Government.
